Supplies needed:

Crayola Markers (Thick and Thin), Crayola crayons, scissors, glue bottle, glue stick, White Paper, Colored Paper, paper bag, pencil, eraser, paint brush, watercolor, coffee or tea, foil

Week 1

Theme - Artist Styles

Op Art - Chess boards that moves drawn with Black sharpie

Supplies needed: Black Sharpie, white paper, Pencil, eraser

Surrealism - Chess pieces that have a different setting such as the queen in an ocean, Paint with Coffee or tea

Supplies needed: Coffee or tea, white paper, pencil, eraser, paint brush, thin markers

Impressionism - Many colors making up one object such as colorful chess pieces. Paint with watercolor.

Supplies needed: watercolor paint, brushes, pencil, eraser, crayons, white paper

Pointillism - Using the end of pencil to create a picture of chess pieces on a chess board.

Supplies needed: pencil, eraser, paint and brush, markers, white paper. Also can make dots with q-tips

Collage - cutting and pasting a picture of something different you have been doing since learning at home including virtual chess.

Markers, Crayons, paint, brushes, glue, pencil, eraser, scissors, colored paper, white paper

Week 2 - Patterns

Origami - Japanese paper folding, add checker pattern before folding.

Supplies needed: markers, white paper or colored paper

History of Chess - Learn patterns in Chess, paint with coffee or tea

Supplies needed: Coffee or tea, white paper, pencil, eraser

Mandala design - draw a circular design filled with patterns. Color with markers

Supplies needed: White paper, markers, crayons, soup cans for tracing

Paper bag - Use paper bags to draw and cut out chess pieces that stand on their own

Supplies needed: brown paper bags, crayons, markers, pencil, eraser

Foil sculpture- Sculpt foil with your hands to form a chess piece then use sharpies to draw and color a chess board.

Supplies needed: foil, black sharpie
